Agreeable to a request to us directed, The undersigned,
after due notice as is by law required on the 26th day of oct. 1868, proceeded to lay out a town way
at Lisbon Falls as follows.

Beginning at a point on
the easterly line of the County road leading from
Lisbon Falls to Hallowell; said point bearing South
61 $\frac{1}{4}$ deg. West from the Southwesterly corner of a
dwelling house belonging to the Norumbega Manufacturing
Co. formerly owned and occupied by the late Aaron
J. West - Thence from said point North 55 $\frac{1}{4}$ deg.
West Three Rods across said County road - Then same
course on land belonging to the heirs of the late Isaac
Tibbets or unknown, and on land of James Booker
Twenty four rods and 11 links, to the Easterly line of the
County Road leading by the dwelling house of James
Booker, said ~~Southwesterly~~ point being two rods &
2 links from the Southwesterly corner of a basement
brick wall now being built by William Small Jrn.
The above described line being the center line of the
said way & that the same be three rods wide, and that
we award for damages to the heirs of the late Isaac
Tibbets or unknown twenty five dollars, considering no
other person aggrieved by said location, and that
the Town be allowed two years in which to make
and open said way for public travel.

Know all men by these presents, that at the April session of the County Commissioners of the County of Androscoggin, for the year 1863, a petition, signed by David Smith and one hundred and five others, was presented to said County Commissioners, praying for a county road in said county; and whereas, after due notice to the parties concerned, to wit, on the 10th day of September, A.D. 1867, the said Commissioners proceeded to view the premises described in said petition, and afterwards gave a hearing to the parties and their witnesses, and whereas after said view and hearing, the said County Commissioners did adjudge and determine that common convenience and necessity do not require the location prayed for, and wholly refused the prayer of said petitioners, and made report of their deligns at the April session, A.D. 1863; and whereas at the Supreme Judicial Court, begun and helden at Auburn, within and for the County of Androscoggin, on the third Tuesday of April, A.D. 1863, the inhabitants of the town of Webster entered their appeal from the judgment of said County Commissioners refusing to locate said highway; and whereas the Justice of the said Supreme Judicial Court, holden as aforesaid, after due proceedings, appointed Enos T. Luce, Frank T. Faulkner and William D. Rock a special committee to act upon the subject matter of said appeal. Now, therefore, the said committee, in pursuance of said appointment, give notice that they will meet at the store of David Larabee, at Webster Corner, in the town of Webster, on Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of August, A.D. 1863, at ten o'clock A.M., and will then proceed to view the route described in said original petition, and immediately after give a hearing to the parties and their witnesses, and then take such further action in the premises in the law requires.





Lisbon & Bowdoin, Division of Bridge

Memorandum of an agreement between the Selectmen of Bowdoin and Lisbon, respecting a division of the Bridge across "Little River Stream" at the foot of Halls Hill -

- 1^o The division of the Bridge shall be fourteen (14) feet East from the face of the stone abutment on the west side of Stream, and forty (40) from the face at the bottom of abutment on East side of Stream.
- 2^o The width of Bridge shall be twenty (20) feet, measuring on the planking -
- 3^o The town of Bowdoin shall build and support a truss, fourteen (14) feet from face of abutment on west side of Stream, on which the town of Lisbon shall be allowed to land their Stringers, and in consideration thereof the town of Lisbon agrees to maintain all that portion of Bridge and abutment west of the said truss, which the town of Bowdoin agrees to build.
- 4^o The distance between the two (2) abutments shall remain the same as at present, that is, a distance of fifty-four (54) feet between the bottoms of the two abutments.

In pursuance of the Commission above written
having been duly sworn, and after notice to all
parties interested, we the undersigned Commissioners
herein named, met the Counsel of the said towns of Lisbon
and Durham at the Maine Central Hotel in said Lisbon on
the 25th day of June A.D. 1873, and thence proceeded to view
the line between said Towns, and having so viewed and heard
such testimony as the parties chose to offer with the suggestions
of Counsel, and duly considered the same, we ascertained and
determined the line between said Towns to be as follows, viz:

Beginning at a point in the middle of the Androscoggin
River, opposite the mouth of Little River Stream - said point
marking the North Westerly corner of the town of Goshen and
the South Westerly corner of the town of Lisbon, and being a
point on the Easterly line of the town of Durham, thence
North Westerly by the middle of said River passing the
Bridge site at Lisbon Falls, Sixty seven (67) feet distant Westerly
from an Iron bolt placed in a ledge on the Lisbon side
of said Androscoggin River - said bolt being in a right line
nine feet distant from the face of the stone abutment standing
on the Lisbon side of said River near the house called and known
as the "Toll House" and Fifteen and one fourth (15 $\frac{1}{4}$) feet from the
South Westerly corner of said abutment, and sixteen feet
from the North Westerly corner of said abutment - thence North
Westerly by the middle of said River to the Northerly line of
said town.


Dear sir:-

I have staked out the location of Webster Street at its junction with Ridge Street at Lisbon Village using the records of the County Commissioners book 4 page 463.

The Commissioners records dated 1905 call for an iron pin driven into the ground which pin is at the intersection of the center lines of Webster and Ridge Streets both of which streets are laid out fifty feet in width.

On making a careful search I failed to find the iron as called for but at the point where the iron should be (using measurements from existing monuments on Webster and Ridge Streets) I found a well preserved surveyors stake which I have carefully tied in and as the stake stands about five feet below the present surface of the highway I have placed an iron pipe over the stake bringing the same to within about nine inches of the surface.

Following is a sketch showing location of the point as described above which also shows on my field book No 90 page 17.






