CALL TO ORDER. The Chairman, Allen Ward, called the meeting to order and led the pledge of allegiance to the flag at 7:00 PM.

## **PUBLIC HEARING**

## A. 2017-2018 SCHOOL BUDGET

At this time the Chairman opened the Public Hearing and the School Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Green, presented the 2017-2018 School Budget.

Superintendent Green said the proposed budget adopted by the School Committee last night totals \$15,735,507, which is up 2.68% or a \$409,967 overall increase over last year's budget. The local contribution is \$6,529,996, which is a 9% increase (\$535,913) over than last year. The State's contribution is a 1.7% decrease (\$146,063) totaling \$8,492,994. The total above EPS is \$1,377,013. He mentioned the school will be utilizing \$39,768 from capital reserve funds to pay the guaranteed performance contract cost. Any remaining balance budgeted for bond payments will lapse into the unassigned fund balance. He pointed out the auditor approved using \$403,721 from the unassigned fund balance to offset expenses for the coming year, which is \$209,451 more than last year. He said student enrollment is around 1,290 this year.

Councilor Ward mentioned he was able to get answers to his questions last night at the School Committee meeting. He said the school's budget first presented to the School Committee started with a \$1.2 million increase going into the budget season; however with cuts that's more likely to be around \$770,000 to \$810,000.

Councilor Ward asked if there were any questions from the public. Seeing none, the Chairman closed the public hearing.
